Some information on Peter and Paul:

Peter, rescued from the power of Herod and Paul, protected from his enemies, proclaim with their lives that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God. Peter in Rome under Nero; Galilean fisherman; spokesman for the Twelve who became “Prince of the Apostles”; two epistles are ascribed to him; patron of those in the fishing industry.

Paul, according to tradition, was martyred in Rome; Pharisee who became the “Apostle of the Gentiles”; his letters may be dated from c.50-65; patron of the lay apostolate, the Cursillo Movement, and Catholic Action; also of Malta and Greece. *The Depositio Martyrum (258)* places the Solemnity of these apostles on this date. Both are the principal patrons of Rome and are mentioned in the Roman Canon.

Feast of St. Peter & St. Paul, 2014.

Seven years ago Pope Benedict XVI preached a homily on the Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul at the famous basilica of St. Paul outside the Walls in Rome, a church entrusted to the care of Benedictine monks. According to ancient tradition the last meeting of the two great apostles, Peter and Paul, took place near the site of the basilica. The two men embraced and blessed each other.

From the earliest times Peter and Paul were inseparable. Peter professed his faith in Christ first; Paul deepened the richness of this faith. Peter founded the first community of Christians who came from the Chosen People; Paul became the Apostle to the Gentiles. With different gifts they worked for one and the same cause, the building of the Church of Christ.

The Office of Readings offers this well-known text of St Augustine: "One day is assigned for the celebration of the martyrdom of the two Apostles. The two were one. Although their martyrdoms occurred on different days, they were one. Peter went first, Paul followed. We celebrate this feast day which is made sacred for us by the blood of these Apostles."

Leo the Great comments: "About their merits and virtues, which surpass all power of speech, we must make no distinctions, because they were equal in their election, alike in their toils, undivided in their death."

We would probably go to confession to Peter sooner than to any of the other apostles. He is perhaps a more striking example of the simple fact of holiness. Jesus says to us as he said, in effect, to Peter: "It is not you who have chosen me, but I who have chosen you. Peter, it is not human wisdom that makes it possible for you to believe, but my Father's revelation. I, not you, will build my Church."

Paul's experience of the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus was the driving force that made him one of the most zealous, dynamic and courageous ambassadors of Christ the Church has ever had. But persecution, humiliation and weakness were his day-by-day carrying of the cross. This carrying of the cross further transformed St. Paul. St. Paul followed Christ in life and in death.

In Rome, since the earliest centuries, the bond that unites Peter and Paul in their mission has acquired a very special significance. Like Romulus and Remus, the two mythical brothers who are said to have given birth to the City, so Peter and Paul were held to be the founders of the Church of Rome.
