Weekly Schedule

(October 13 to October 20)

Abraham Lincoln, Feb. 12, 1809-April 15, 1865

Wikipedia provides basic information on Abraham Lincoln, who served as 16th President of the United States from March 4, 1861, to April 15, 1865. Lincoln guided the Union through the Civil War, and issued the 1863 Emancipation Proclamation, giving human dignity to slaves. He delivered the Gettysburg Address, the most famous oration in American history on Nov. 16, 1863. John Wilkes Booth killed Lincoln at Ford's Theater in Washington, D.C., on April 15, 1865.

James Buchanan was the 15th President of the United States, the only bachelor to hold the office. Andrew Johnson succeeded Lincoln as President. Lincoln, who was 6'4" tall, was the first president to wear a beard while in office. Lincoln's face appears on the U.S. penny and also on the \$5 bill. Lincoln named Salmon P. Chase as Chief Justice of the United States in 1864; Chase's face appears on the \$10,000 bill. The Lincoln Memorial, with its famous statue by Daniel Chester French, was dedicated in Washington, D.C., in 1922.

Abraham Lincoln was born in a log cabin. He educated himself by reading borrowed books. He worked splitting rails, clerking in a general store and then as a country lawyer. Honest Abe, as he became known, served in the Illinois General Assembly for eight years and in the U.S. House of Representatives for one term, before his election as this nation's first Republican president. He was the first U.S. president born outside the 13 original states.

On Nov. 19, 1863, President Lincoln dedicated the cemetery where thousands of soldiers were buried after the bloody battle of Gettysburg. He spoke for just two minutes. He followed a very famous orator, Edward Everett, who spoke for two full hours. We remember these words of Abraham Lincoln:

"Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation, conceived in Liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal. Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation or any nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field, as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live...We here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain—that that government of the people, by the people and for the people shall not perish from the earth."
